On April 9th, the 15th "Story Meeting" was held at Yumemido. The lecturer this time was one of only 100 people in Japan who has a 14-year-old daughter with an incurable epilepsy disease called "Otagawa syndrome," and she brought her daughter to the lecture. We formed a group for patients with intractable diseases, and in collaboration with a food manufacturer, we developed foods with thickeners added to them in order to feed sushi and hamburgers to patients who are prone to aspiration, and we delivered children's wheelchairs that were no longer in use to Cambodia. When I made a donation and went to the site for the presentation ceremony, I saw a wheelchair reverently displayed and said, "It's a waste and I can't use it." I heard about the powerful activities. At the end of the study, we explained the activities of the food bank and asked the eight participants to take home the distributed items.
